


3. How much of the time do you think you can trust the government in Washington to do what is right - just about always, most of the time or only some of the time?






6. To what extent do you agree with the following statement: I trust Mayor Holden to look out for the interests of people like me.








27. Are you Hispanic or Latino?





28. Are you currently married, living with a partner, separated, divorced, widowed, or have you never been married?






